A MESSAGE FROM MRS PETERSEN

Dear Spring Ridge Families,

Welcome to the 2024-2025 school year! It is hard to believe that we already have 2 weeks under our belt! Students have transitioned well from summer break to the start of a brand new school year. Thank you for your help in making this transition go very smoothly!

On behalf of the students and teachers, I would like to extend a huge THANK YOU to our PTO for decorating the school campus for our first day, assisting the teachers with classroom materials, and making Open House a success. Thank you for your support in making Spring Ridge Elementary a great place to learn.

Our school theme this year is "Plant Seeds of Kindness"! We know that through strong teamwork between parents, staff, and community members, we can ensure that each child will reach their individual potential academically, socially, and emotionally. Thank you for your commitment to this teamwork!

This year Parent-Teacher Conferences will be held in September again. We are scheduling PT Conferences just as we have the last couple of years, by using an on-line conference scheduler called Pick-A-Time. Parent-Teacher Conferences will be on Tuesday, September 24th and Wednesday, September 25th from 3:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. each evening. Directions will be sent home with your child on Friday, September 6th, so you know how to proceed with scheduling your child's time. This is a first-come first-serve scheduling software. The on-line scheduler will open up at [10:00 a.m.](#) on Monday, September 9, 2023 and will close at 11:59p.m. on Sunday, September 22, 2023. As a result, the sooner you register the more likely you are to get your preferred time. In addition, if you have more than one student, it will not allow you to schedule them back-to-back. The one exception is if you have children who have the same teacher. It will require a fifteen-minute time slot between the two conferences. This allows for travel time and for conferences that have gotten behind schedule. Once you begin the process, if you have questions please feel free to contact the office (402-637-0204) or your child's teacher.

No Dogs on School Grounds



Just a reminder that dogs are not allowed on school grounds when school is in session. Even the most well-mannered dogs, when surrounded by little hands and loud voices of children, may react in a way that we would not expect. In addition, some of our children are allergic to dogs. Thank you for your help with this!



Traffic Reminders:



It's no secret that Spring Ridge Elementary is not the easiest to navigate when dropping and picking up children. Even veteran Spring Ridge parents find it easy to forget the specifics of daily drop-off and pick-up. The utmost priority is the safety of our children. One accident at the school is one too many.

Here are a few basic reminders:

Morning Drop-off Procedures –

1. Students may be dropped off curbside between the designated orange cones at the front of the building. Always enter the drive from the east and remain in the right lane (curbside). Keep moving forward as far as possible. Please stop only once between the orange cones.
2. Students may be dropped off along the west curb of 178th Street. Note 178th Street is a one-way north between the hours of 7:00 A.M.-9:00 A.M. and 2:00 P.M.-4:00 P.M. Students may use the sidewalks along the staff parking lot or the sidewalk along the front of the building to bring them to the appropriate entrance. Please do not use the staff parking lot to drop off or pick up students.

Afternoon Pick-up Procedures:

1. Students are to be picked up curbside at the front entrance of the building. Always enter the front drive from the east and remain in the right lane (curbside). Keep moving forward as far as possible, picking up children between designated cones. Please do not use the drive-through lane for picking up children. Students are not allowed to walk through traffic. Please do not leave your car unattended if you are parked curbside as this disrupts the flow of traffic.
2. Students may be picked up along the west curb of 178th Street.

Please do not park in front of a safety crosswalk. This places our safety patrol students in a dangerous position. The parked cars can obstruct the view of on-coming traffic. Thank you!



Helpful Reminders:

The beginning of the school year is a great time to remind students and parents about general procedures followed at school each day. These will help ensure a successful day and year for children, families, and teachers. Thank you!

- Look through your child's backpack and go over the items sent home each day with your child.
- Help your child remember to return papers as they are due.
- Help your child arrive to school on time.
- Call the office 402-637-0204 each day your child will be tardy or absent.
- Sign in at the office and wear a visitor's badge every time you are in the building.
- Deliver forgotten items to the office, not the classroom.
- Send a note with your child if he/she is doing something different after school (car-pooling instead of walking, etc.)
- Come into the office to sign your student out during the day.



Meeting with Teachers:



Parents wishing to confer with teachers are asked to call the school office or e-mail the teacher. If the teacher is unable to take your call, we will gladly leave them a message to return your call at their earliest convenience.

If wishing to meet in person with a teacher, please schedule an appointment in advance. Often, teachers feel bad when a parent arrives at school to confer with them and they cannot meet with that parent due to other demands and responsibilities placed upon them. By scheduling an appointment they will be prepared to meet with you to address your questions and/or concerns.

Please sign in at the Office:

All visitors (including parents) who enter the building must sign in at the office. This procedure is in place as a part of our safety plan. We encourage you to have your children walk to their classrooms themselves after you drop them off in the morning. It instills a sense of independence for them.

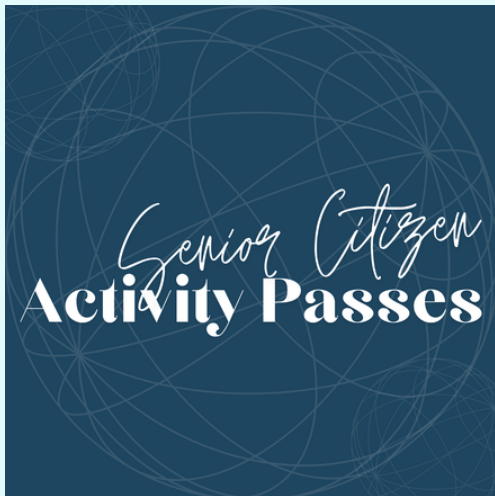
Plan to Attend Parent-Teacher Conferences September 24 and 25:

Tuesday, September 24 and Wednesday, September 25, Spring Ridge Elementary will be conducting parent-teacher conferences. You will want to use this limited time to its best advantage. Sharing information about your child with his/her teacher will enable us to provide a learning program that will best meet the needs of your child. We hope that the conferences are productive and provide you with a true understanding of the progress your child is making in the classroom.

Directions will be sent home with students on Friday, September 6th regarding how to schedule your PT Conference Time for your child through the Pick-A-Time website/tool. If you have questions, please contact the Spring Ridge Office at 402-637-0204.

EPS Senior Citizen Activity Passes

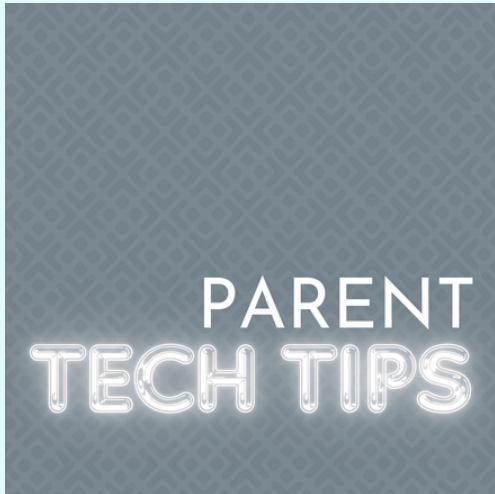
Per EPS Board Policy 1006.07, District residents aged 65+ are eligible for a free activity pass which admits the holder to District-sponsored events and activities. GOOGLE CLASSROOM GUARDIAN EMAIL SUMMARIES

Starting September 6th, guardians will be able to receive email summaries about their student's activity in Google Classroom. Guardians will receive an email invitation on September 6th and will need to accept the invitation in order to receive Google Classroom email summaries. When you receive the invite email and click the accept button, you will be taken to a page verifying your email address. Please make sure this is the email address you would like to use before clicking accept. If it is not the correct email address, do NOT click decline or accept, and see bullet number 3 under "Get email summaries" in this document [Guardian Email Summaries - for Guardians](#).

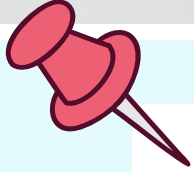
You may not receive an invite email if you are still signed up from last year or if teacher(s) have not enabled email notifications in their Google Classrooms.

In email summaries, you can review:

- Missing work—Work not turned in when the summary was sent
- Upcoming work—Work that is due today and tomorrow (for daily emails) or that is due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails)
- Class activities—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers
- Email summaries do not include grades.

If there's no activity to report, or if a teacher turns off email notifications, you might not get an email summary.

Note from the Nurse... Welcome back to school!

My name is Elizabeth Page and I am the school nurse at Elkhorn South, Spring Ridge, and West Bay. I am in each building 2 half days per week. If you ever need to contact me, please feel free to email me at epage@epsne.org with any questions or concerns. Here is some important information to review:

~Physical and Immunization Requirements~

Nebraska law requires that all students have a physical examination upon entry into school, at the seventh grade level, or when transferring from out-of-state. Upon entry and out of state students must also show **proof of a visual evaluation (to include testing for amblyopia, strabismus, internal and external eye health, and visual acuity)**. Lastly, immunization records must be submitted before attending classes for all students. Please visit this link: [Summary of the School Immunization Rules and Regulations](#) to view specific vaccine requirements. ***If you have not turned in your Kindergarten or new out-of-state student's paperwork, please do so ASAP.***

~Medication Policy~

If your student requires any medication (over-the-counter and/or prescription) while at school, each medication must have a [Medication Authorization Form](#) signed by the parent and a physician before we can administer. All medications must not be expired and provided in the original packaging or container with a label. For prescription medications, please only provide a maximum of 30 day supply. All medication must be dropped off in the office by a parent or guardian. **Please do not send medication in your child's backpack.**

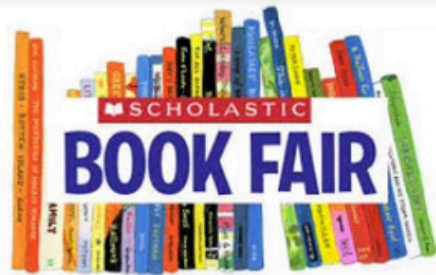
~Students with Asthma, Severe Allergies, Diabetes, and/or Seizures~

If your child has asthma, severe allergies, diabetes, and/or seizures, and you have not yet done so, please submit an [Action Plan](#) signed by both a parent and physician. ***Plans must be updated annually.***

~Sick Child Policy~

Just a reminder to monitor your child for symptoms of illness and to keep them home if they have any of the following: **fever >100.0, vomiting, diarrhea, rash, head lice, eye infection.**
*Students must be fever free without the use of fever reducing meds for 24 hours before returning to school.

Parenting Pathways

Ever wonder why your kiddo has nothing to say after a whole day of activity in school? It's not that nothing happened worth talking about, it's more likely that the great questions you're asking just need to be asked a little later. Giving kiddos a chance to decompress after school before expecting them to tell us all about it is okay and necessary!

Here are some things to try before asking questions...

- I'm so glad to see you.
- You look like you worked hard today!
- I'm so proud of you.
- I'm so glad I am your _____ (Mom, Dad, etc.).
- Hi! (pair with a warm smile and a pause)
- Give a hug, fist bump or pat on the back

Later when they are ready, try some of these!

What to say to your kid instead of "how was school?"

FEELINGS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Did anything make you feel happy today? • Did anything make you feel sad today? • Tell me about one thing you did today that made you feel proud (and why).
FRIENDSHIPS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who made you laugh today? • Who did you play with? • Is there someone you want to be friends with but aren't yet?
LEARNING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Did you learn one new thing today? • Tell me about a story you read (and what you liked). • Tell me something you know today that you didn't know yesterday.
CLASSROOM DYNAMICS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What games did you play at recess? • What are you most looking forward to tomorrow? • Did you see anyone being kind/unkind today?

Try it!



What: Candle breathing is a visual way for kids to stop and take five controlled breaths.

How: Hold five fingers open in front of your mouth. Blow on each finger as if you were blowing out a candle and put the finger down. Repeat until all fingers are down.

Cuddles & Covers

This is a great book to encourage kids to talk about their feelings and empowers them to take control.

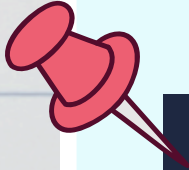

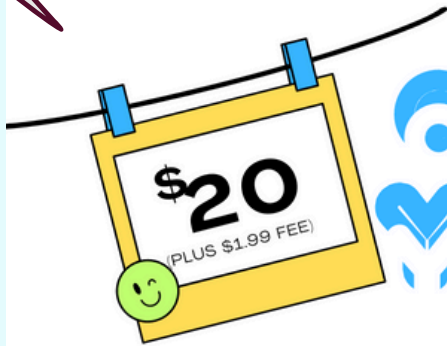

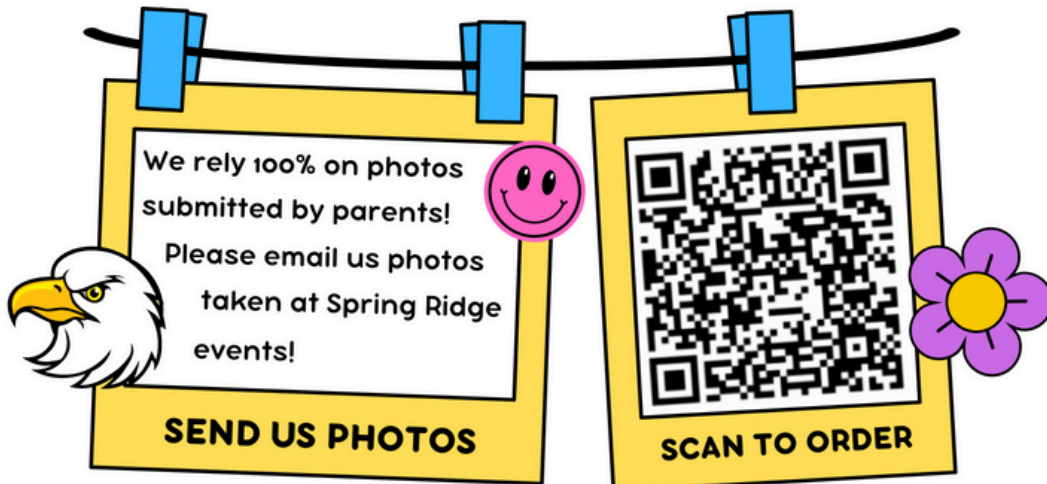
